SHOKAN, N.Y. — The New York City Department of Environmental Protection will team up with school groups, business leaders, environmental advocates, local nonprofits and watershed citizens to remove litter and recyclables from public recreation areas at the Ashokan Reservoir on Sunday, Sept. 15, during the department's sixth Reservoir Cleanup Day.

The cleanup will begin at 12 p.m. and is expected to finish by 3 p.m.

Volunteers remove debris from areas that are generally used for fishing and boating access.

Cleanups this year will happen at Ashokan and Pepacton reservoirs in the Catskills, and at Kensico, Lake Gleneida, Muscoot and New Croton reservoirs in the Hudson Valley.
